

RICHARD KELLY, MD, JD, MPH, FASA, FCLM Clinical Professor, University of California, Irvine Approved instructor by the Medical Board of California

Dr. Richard Kelly is a board-certified anesthesiologist and clinical professor at the University of California, Irvine. Dr. Kelly studied biochemistry and theology as an undergraduate at Harvard University. He completed his master's degree in Public Health at U.C. Berkeley and dual professional degrees in Law and Medicine at Stanford University.

His research interests include the societal consequences of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act; the ethical and legal implications of physician fatigue; medical professionalism; and national trends in medical malpractice awards. He is associated with the Health Policy Research Institute at UC Irvine School of Medicine where he teaches classes in Health Politics & Policy. Dr. Kelly also lectures nationally and internationally on topics of legal medicine, health policy, and medical ethics. He spends the remainder of his academic time teaching medical students, residents, and working as an anesthesiologist.

Dr. Kelly is an Editor-in-Chief Emeritus of the Journal of Legal Medicine and a fellow of both the American Society of Anesthesiologists and the American College of Legal Medicine. He is an active member of the World Association for Medical Law, a member of the State Bar of California, and a member of the Bar of the Supreme Court of the United States.
